Should You Mount Your TV Above a Fireplace?

Despite what you may see on home design shows, wall-mounting a TV above a fireplace is generally not a good idea for two reasons:

- 1. To see the best possible picture from your set, the center point of the screen should be directly in line with your eyes when you're seated and watching TV. If you mount the screen high on the wall above your fireplace, your eyes will have to adjust to focus on the center point and you'll have to crane your neck during a two-hour movie, which can lead to headaches and sore muscles.
- 2. If it's a working fireplace, the heat from the fires could do damage to your set. That's why every TV manual warns you to keep your set in a cool place.

Given this, you may want to display artwork above the fireplace and place your TV elsewhere in the room.

Beware of Scams Involving Gift Card Payments

Have you been asked to go get gift cards to pay for something? Don't do it. Gift cards are for gifts, not payments.

The FTC is hearing from people who say they've received calls claiming to be from the IRS, or tech support, or a so-called family member in need. For example, many have received threatening voice messages from a scammer pretending to be from the IRS, who convinces the person that to avoid being arrested for tax evasion, he or she must pay the fine with iTunes or other gift cards.

Those who fall victim to this scam go to a local store and buy the requested gift cards. Next, the scammer demands the gift card numbers and PIN, and the money is gone. Scammers love gift cards since they're the equivalent of giving cash and are nearly untraceable, unless you act almost immediately.

If you get a call like this, hang up. No reputable company or government agency (including the IRS) will ever demand payment with gift cards. Don't believe emails with this type of message either.

On the surface, these scams appear easy to spot and hard to believe, but Americans have been swindled out of millions of dollars from them. These callers are highly trained and can be very convincing.

Also be on the lookout for another gift card scam targeting Amazon shoppers. It works like this: When shoppers find items they want on Amazon that are listed for sale by third party sellers, they're told to email the seller directly before placing the order. That's when the bait-and-switch begins.



Once the victims describe the item they want, they receive payment emails that appear to come from Amazon but are actually fake emails from the scammer. The instructions say to purchase an Amazon gift card and send the number and PIN from the card to the seller in order to complete the payment process.

The scammer then takes the card information and depletes the gift card. The victim is out the money spent on the gift card, and Amazon is unable to help since the card was purchased legitimately and used by the scammer.

Beginner's Guide to Streaming Movies and TV Shows

If you haven't yet jumped on the streaming bandwagon, this article is for you! It covers the basics to help you get started enjoying this entertainment technology.

What is streaming?

Streaming is content sent in compressed form in a continuous stream over the internet and played as it arrives. The user does not have to wait to download a file to play it.

What devices are needed?

You can watch streaming movies and TV shows on your smartphone, tablet, laptop, desktop computer, HDTV, or "smart TV." For example, you could connect your laptop to your HDTV with an HDMI cable



and stream on your laptop and watch on the TV screen. If you have a "smart TV," it has built-in apps (and app stores) and networking to get on the internet. You can use them to download most of the streaming apps you'd want.

What streaming apps are available?

You have many options here, too. Here are a few of the most popular ones:

- Netflix You can watch past seasons of TV shows and recent movies at a low monthly cost. Netflix also offers original shows such as *Orange is the New Black* and *House of Cards*.
- Amazon This streaming service is available to Amazon Prime members. Like Netflix, it offers many TV shows and movies to choose from as well as its own original content.
- Hulu Plus You can get next-day access to shows from ABC, NBC, Fox, and CW, along with some cable channels. Hulu Plus also offers some movies and original TV shows.
- Dish's Sling TV Sling TV offers about 20 channels in its basic package including ESPN, ABC Family, AMC, and Food Network but no broadcast channels like CBS or NBC.
 Add-on packages for sports, movies, kids, lifestyles, and world news are also available.
- HBO Now New episodes are available through apps about the same time they are shown on TV. Current and past seasons of most HBO shows are available on demand, as well as hundreds of movies.

What are the internet requirements?

For a good streaming experience, you'll probably want internet download speeds of 20 Mbps or more.
