

Anti-Robocall Measure is Signed into Law

The measure is called the Pallone-Thune TRACED Act, named for key proponents Rep. Frank Pallone, D-New Jersey, and Sen. John Thune, R-South Dakota. TRACED stands for Telephone Robocall Abuse Criminal Enforcement and Deterrence. It was created to take aim at the illegal robocalls and spoofed calls often used by scammers.

Under the TRACED Act:

- Phone companies over time must implement call-authentication technology to ensure the information that appears on Caller ID is correct. Consumers would face no additional line-item charge for the service.
- The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) within a year must ensure consumers are offered robocall-blocking services with no additional line-item charge.
- The FCC will have greater powers to deter violators with larger fines (as much as \$10,000 per call) and a longer statute of limitations.
- The FCC must tell the U.S. attorney general if it finds repeated robocall violations with an intent to defraud, cause harm, or wrongfully obtain anything of value. The aim is to step up criminal prosecutions by the Justice Department.

Certain robocalls remain legal, such as those from legitimate charities, and informational calls about school closures and the like.

Strategies for Maximizing Your Home's Wi-Fi Performance

Given how much you use your home's Wi-Fi network, you want the signals to be strong and reliable all over. If they're not, give these strategies a try:

- Place your router in the most central location possible. As you consider a central location, think top to bottom as well as side to side. In addition, don't put your router in an enclosed place.
- Restart your router weekly. Some router firmware is a little "buggy," and over time it gets slow. A simple restart often helps. Unplug your router, wait 30 seconds, and then plug it back in.
- Get a new router. Yours may not be built to accommodate today's faster internet speeds.
- Buy a wireless range extender. Routers typically broadcast Wi-Fi signals pretty well up to about 150 feet, beyond which the signal can get weak. For a large area, or if you have thick walls, a wireless range extender can boost your signal.

Crackle (crackle.com) hosts a library of mainstream titles, including popular older TV shows and movies. Crackle has also been developing some of its own content.


